In accordance with the proposal presented to the Seventh General Assembly of the International Union of Pure and Applied Physics, the Science Council of Japan wishes to extend its invitation to hold a Conference on Fundamental Theoretical Physics in Kyoto, Japan in 1953.

We believe that such a convention would contribute much toward the advancement and exchange of knowledge in the field, since it is an area of science where this country has made much progress.

This Council will be in a position to contribute a sum equivalent at the present rate of exchange to at least \$22,000 toward the expenses of the Conference.

It is proposed to invite distinguished physicists from the world over, and we wish hereby to present our request for a special subvention of \$12,000 to supplement the above, to aid in defraying the travel expenses of our formal guests.

I was much gratified to receive word that a proposal presented by Dr. Kotani at the recent General Assembly of the IUPAP for holding a Conference on Fundamental Theoretical Physics in Japan in 1953 was very favorably received by you and by all.
