The Government of Japan shall save harmless the United States Commission and the Government of the United States of America against any and all liability and damages of any kind and for any cause whatsoever arising out of the lease of the fuel elements leased to the Government of Japan, and the use of the fuel elements with contained U-235 by the Government of Japan as reactor fuel or the possession of such fuel elements of the Government of Japan while radioactively cooling in Japan or in transit in either direction between the United States and Japan and until acceptance of delivery by the United States Commission: ( Provided, however, that if such injury or damage is caused solely by the negligent packing of the United States Commission, this assumption of liability by the Government of Japan shall not apply. )
