

Dear Sir,

The proceedings of the Second United Nations International Conference on the Peaceful Uses of Atomic Energy, directed to be held by the General Assembly and organized by the United Nations Secretariat under the personal guidance of the Secretary-General and his Advisory Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Atomic Energy, have been brought to a successful conclusion.

Great benefit has been derived by the Agency staff from closely following both the actual proceedings of the Conference and the excellent scientific and administrative preparations carried out by the Conference Secretariat. 
