It is somewhat difficult to get here  
papers published in Japan; not always but sometimes.  
So I should be very happy if you could send  
me your I & II, as well as the other of a more  
mathematical character. I hope you have still  
a copy of I, although it is very improbable; owing  
to its historical interest I should like very much  
to get it as we don't have any here. The only copy was lost!

I send to you a tiffle which is in fact the analysis of your eq. (23); I hoped by doing it in detail to gain a more close view about the characteristics of heavy electrons as particles. I have been thinking a lot about this subject, not from the interaction point of view but more from a structural point of view. Very queer, but very promising things seem to be hidden in your marvellous discovery.

Heitler was here and Bhabha too. Heitler has a new paper to be published in the Proceedings, which seems very interesting, on cosmic ray problems. Stueckelberg is also publishing a small paper in Switzerland.

In your paper III you announce more others; may I ask you to send them to me as soon as they are printed? I shall be very pleased and I thank you
