244th Meeting — Chicago — November 21-22, 1941

The 244th regular meeting of the American Physical Society is to be held in Chicago, Illinois on Friday and Saturday, the 21st and 22nd of November 1941, at the University of Chicago.

The local committee recommends the Windermere Hotel, 1642 East 56th Street, near the campus.

Titles and abstracts of all papers destined for presentation at this meeting must be delivered at the office of the American Physical Society (the address below) not later than **Friday, October 17, 1941**. They must be delivered in *duplicate (original and one carbon copy)*. **The length of an abstract must not exceed the equivalent of two hundred words: note in this connection the rules quoted below.**

GENERAL RULES RELATING TO PAPERS

The time allowed for the oral presentation of a contributed paper is ten minutes at most.

When two or more papers are contributed by the same member, all but one will be placed on the "Supplementary Programme". For each paper on this programme the Secretary will indicate a session at which it may be presented. The presiding officer at this meeting may call for it when the other papers are completed, may require that it be given in shortened form, or may read it by title.

Authors who intend in advance that their papers shall be read by title are urgently requested to notify the Secretary, so that indication of the fact may be made in the program.

RULE RELATING TO LENGTH OF ABSTRACTS

The greatest permissible length for an abstract is two hundred words or the equivalent thereof. Each display formula will be counted as the equivalent of forty words; each line in a table, as the equivalent of ten words; each reference, as the equivalent of ten words.
